P25 Radio System Agreement between RACOM and Jasper County of Newton, Iowa

This agreement is entered into by Jasper County (Buyer) and RACOM Corporation (Seller) and agreed upon on February ______, 2017.

This P25 solution includes radio infrastructure, mobile and portable radios, installation and maintenance services per the attached quotation, Exhibit A.

The mutual terms of this agreement include:

- a. Jasper County purchases the Newton site as proposed and outlined in the quotation and described here: "Site" refers to the Radio Frequency (RF) and Microwave backhaul equipment that will be located at the Jasper County Engineer tower, 910 Nth 11th Ave E, Newton IA. This P25 radio equipment will reside in the Annex building owned by Jasper County and radio and microwave antennas will be installed on the tower that is owned by Jasper County. Jasper County will provide all civils examples facility, AC power, HVAC, 24 x 7 x 365 physical access.
- b. Jasper County will not have any additional access fees for use of RACOM's entire P25 network(s). This assumes the use of capable radios and 28e agreements with other partnering agencies
- c. 3 Budget Year Plan RACOM will provide 0% financing of the site and radios over the current 2016-2017, 2017-2018 and 2018-2019 years.
- d. Offer valid thru 3/31/2017 radios ordered after this date are under normal payment terms
- e. RACOM will accept any down payment available at the time of order. The remaining balance will be payable as follows:
 - o Payment #1 @ 1/3 of the balance due prior to June 30, 2017
 - o Payment #2 @ 1/3 of the balance (for a total of 66.7%) due prior to July 30, 2017
 - Payment #3 @ 1/3 of the balance (for a total of 100%) due prior to July 30, 2018
- f. Comprehensive Maintenance Agreement (CMA) (this will include unlimited radio programming) during the 3 year term of financing. Cost for CMA shown below and on system proposal.
 - o Jasper County Sheriff CMA: At 71 radios the cost is \$5,325 per year, for years 1, 2, and 3
 - o RACOM performs all programming under the CMA. RACOM performs all radio removal/install work at hourly rate of \$75/hour during the 3 year financing term
 - Jasper County has an annual cost of \$12K/year in site/microwave maintenance (this does not include dispatch console or radio maintenance)
- g. BeOn 50 Apple and/or Android applications included. Applications above 50 charged at normal rates
- h. Radio quantity can change up to 5% from the totals above and these T&C's remain in force but 100% of radios must be purchased from RACOM



- i. It may be in the best interest of the governmental agencies within Jasper County to source other communication solutions from RACOM to ensure proper integration or preferred services and maintenance. Therefore, governmental agencies within Jasper County, including each municipality, may, at their option, purchase public safety solutions from RACOM under this agreement. All Vehicle or PSAP products, installation and maintenance services are eligible, with final pricing subject to the approval of the purchasing agency.
 - o Additional Harris P25 radios added to the system are eligible for a 25% discount
