The Police Department and Newton community have lost 3 local heroes as a result of on-duty or job related tragedies over the past 40 years. Officer Bobby Barrickman was killed in an on-duty motor vehicle accident on September 30, 1979, Officer Daniel McPherren was killed in a shootout on September 13, 1985 and Lieutenant Patrick Richardson died of a heart attack while training for the Police Department's bi-annual physical fitness test on September 1, 2013.

Beyond their service and sacrifice for the citizens of Newton, Officer Barrickman was a veteran of the U.S. Marine Corp and served in the Vietnam War. Lieutenant Richardson was a member of the U.S. Army and served as a military police officer.


lowa Administrative Code 761-131.10-131.15(321) allows for the naming of lowa bridges in honor of individuals who have had extraordinary public service or some exemplary contribution to the public good or outstanding service to the nation, this state or the person's community and have a connection to the community where the highway or bridge is located.

In memory of these heroes, it's proposed that three bridges within or bordering the Newton city limits be named in their honor as described below:

- Officer Bobby Barrickman Memorial Bridge (Bridge ID#5068.3R080 I-80 168mm E/W)
- Officer Daniel McPherren Memorial Bridge (Bridge ID#5063.9R080 I-80 164mm E/W)

Citizens in Support of the Restoration and Preservation of Red Bridge Est. 2011



March 13, 2018

Doug, Joe, and Denny,

Joe Otto from the Jasper County Historical Museum here. The museum Board recently approved me using our non-profit status to apply for grants to secure funding for the Red Bridge project. I have targeted a \$50,000 grant from the State Historical Society of Iowa. The grant is through the SHSI's Historical Resource Development Program (HRDP). It is an emergency grant for historic properties that are threatened by the elements or neglect. Red Bridge meets both of those criteria. Should we win the grant, it would take another \$32,000 in fundraising to get the bridge off the river. I've started a pledge drive to raise this money and have already secured about \$4,000. Additionally, property owner Daniel Nolin has reached out to me and offered permission to let the bridge be set down on his property for an extended period of time at no cost. He owns the parcel on the north bank, west of Red Bridge Street.

As property owner, I would need your permission to apply for this grant. I've drafted a motion for your consideration and attached it to this document. The motion acknowledges that the Museum is applying for this grant and nothing more.

Should we win the grant, then we would have to have deeper discussions about an ownership transfer. I spoke to Dennis P. about procedure, and he said an ownership transfer would involve review by the Engineer's office and the Attorney's office, to ensure the County is in compliance with necessary permitting and also not adding any more exposure to liabilities. In December Mike J. made preliminary comments about a transfer. I've attached his comments below the draft of the motion. On the last page you will find the cover letter that would be sent to the SHSI. The rest of the SHSI packet contains pictures, museum info, a contractor bid, budgetary info, and a timeline. I did not include any of this here but am happy to go over the entire packet with you.

I have requested inclusion of this item on the agenda of the March 20th Board meeting. I am happy to discuss this with you ahead of time, in person or over the phone. I could stop by the courthouse at a time convenient for you, or alternatively you are welcome to drop by the museum any weekday between 9am and 4pm. My phone at the museum is 641-792-9118.

Comments about Red Bridge property transfer by Mike Jacobson, December 2017

I certainly would want a release from the State Historic Preservation Officer, DNR and Army Corps of Engineers before any agreement can be reached with a group to remove the bridge. I would also want a hold harmless agreement with the outside group and contractor for any potential violation of DNR or Army Corp of Engineers rules and regulations. I would also want hold harmless and insurance against any liability that the County may have for the move of the bridge on county, city and State roads and highways.

From my Google research it appears that the Bridge was sold for \$1 to the City of Winterset by Madison County. FEMA was involved after Madison County Secondary Roads requested assistance. FEMA asked the Madison County Historic Preservation Commission to seek possible mitigation solutions since the bridge was protected because of its age. FEMA approved a move of the bridge to the Cedar Lake Recreational Trail Project as a pedestrian and Bicycle Bridge, in the city of Winterset. A grant was received from the Iowa Department of Transportation State Recreational Trail Program to fund the move of the bridge. The Grant was \$500,000 and was awarded to Winterset and Winterset Municipal Utility. The total cost of the project was estimated at \$1,066,590 in the application. I would presume that included restoration. FEMA was involved because the bridge was damaged in a flood and needed to be replaced.



Citizens in Support of the Restoration and Preservation of Red Bridge Est. 2011



March 6, 2018

This is a summary of the Save Red Bridge project going on in Jasper County. In the past year a movement has sprung up to save the county's last historic truss bridge from collapse. Red Bridge crosses Skunk River in Fairview Township, about 1.5 miles south of Reasnor. It was built in 1892. It is a Warren-truss model, which was unique for the time period, as the State of Iowa adopted this model for all trusses in the 1910s. In 1994 it was added to the National Register of Historic Places because it is a very early example of that style. Around 2004 the County closed Red Bridge to traffic and ceased all maintenance. Since then it has slowly deteriorated. The piers are rotted, waterlogged, and splitting, much of the decking has been removed, and there is evidence of intentionally set fires. In the last 25 years the Jasper County Supervisors have approved demolition of all the county's historic truss bridges, except for Red Bridge. Because it is the last one, saving it assumes county-wide importance.

The plan involves moving the bridge to a park in the City of Colfax, where it will be restored as part of a pedestrian walkway that connects a new city park, Quarry Springs, to the downtown business district.

In February of 2017 Preservation Iowa designated Red Bridge as one of the state's most endangered historic properties. That was the catalyst for 578 citizens to petition the County Supervisors to take official action. In June of 2017 the Supervisors agreed not to intentionally demolish it. Limited public resources prevented the project's progression, but the County has been supportive of the Jasper County Historical Museum taking up the torch. With its nonprofit status the museum is applying for a \$50,000 grant from the State of Iowa to complete Phase One – having the bridge extracted from the river and set on the bank. The contractor involved is Boulder Contractors, who did a similar project in Madison County in 2016-17. Saving Red Bridge happens in three phases. Phase One is extraction. Phase Two is relocation to Colfax. Phase Three is rebuilding the bridge on new piers and restoring it to look like new. Once completed, Red Bridge will be the focal point of the City of Colfax and a tourist attraction.

The County Supervisors own the bridge and are supportive of this grant application. Should the grant be awarded, the Supervisors and the Museum will explore the possibility of an ownership transfer. Because this is a public property spanning a state-owned stream, there are complex legal and permitting issues that would need to be worked out well in advance.

Any support that the State Historical Society can provide would be gratefully received. Below are pictures of the bridge that show its historical value and condition. Below that are Google Earth maps that show its current location, relocation route, and proposed new location.



This proposal for bridge inspection and rating services for your 2018 and 2019 programs is submitted in accordance with your request for professional structural engineering services. You have asked us to reinspect and rate approximately 152 structures in 2018 and approximately 200 in 2019 from the attached lists for the Standard Rating and HS20 or HL-93 Design Trucks. We will complete Program Manager and Team Leader assignments, provide master lists, cost estimating and summary listing per the Iowa DOT and FHWA guidelines and requirements.

We propose to reinspect these 152 structures in 2018 for a lump sum fee of \$27,090.00 and 200 structures in 2019 for a lump sum fee of \$35,980.00. We will perform any required load rating computations including 'SHV' trucks, update scour evaluations and complete fracture critical inspections to justify changes, deficiencies, replacements, repairs, funding, etc., at the following estimated rates:

• Load Rating Calculations: \$115.00 Each

Updated Level A or B Scour Evaluations: \$ 90.00 Each

• Fracture Critical Inspections: \$600.00 Each
