


October is Breast Cancer Awareness Month, making it a good time to think about how substance use can affect one's risk of cancer.

Alcohol has been linked to cancers of the mouth, pharynx and larynx (throat and voice box), esophagus, liver, colon, rectum, and breast. Recent studies have shown that non-drinkers have a lower risk of breast cancer than women who drink just 1-2 alcoholic drinks per day. These are based on standard drink sizes: 12 oz of beer, 8 oz of malt liquor, 5 oz of wine, and 1.5 oz of distilled spirits.

The link between alcohol and breast cancer in women is related to estrogen levels in the body. Alcohol is known to increase estrogen in both men and women; this may be the reason that alcohol poses a greater risk of breast cancer in women. To reduce risk of breast cancer in women, the American Cancer Society recommends either abstaining from alcohol or having no more than one alcoholic drink per day.

#### INTRODUCTION

In accordance with the informal competition procedures provided for in 11 Iowa Administrative Code rule 118.9, the Department of Health and Human Services (the Agency), in collaboration with the Jasper/Poweshiek/Tama (JPT) Decategorization Board seeks a gualified entity to provide services to children and families who are involved, or at-risk of involvement, with the Department of Health and Human Services or Juvenile Court Services in Jasper, Poweshiek, and Tama counties.

The Agency anticipates the term of any resulting contract will be from December 2, 2024, to June 30, 2025. The resulting contract has the potential for one, one (1) year extension. The contract is limited to a maximum of \$25,000 for the initial contract period. The maximum value of the contract with all potential renewals is \$50,000. All contracts and renewals are subject to availability of funds.

The JPT Decategorization Board has discretion to fund services in each county separately or to fund a combined approach to serve families in multiples counties.

Proposals should include the Bidder's cost proposal and sufficient information regarding the Bidder's ability to perform the services sought to enable the Agency to make a judgment about the Bidder's ability to perform the work identified in the Scope of Services. The Bidder should also include references with its proposal.

The Agency reserves the right to reject any or all proposals in whole or in part, to advertise for new proposals, to abandon the need for such services, and to cancel this Informal Competitive Solicitation at any time prior to the execution of the written contract.

All information submitted by a Bidder may be treated as a public record by the Agency unless the Bidder properly requests that the information be treated as confidential information in accordance with the public records laws of the State of Iowa at the time its proposal is submitted.

The evaluation committee's selection will be subject to the final approval of the Agency. The proposals will be evaluated, and a recommendation will be made using the following criteria, which are listed in no particular order:

If there is a tie for the best proposal and only one of the Bidders is an Iowa business, the Iowa business shall be given preference over the out of state Bidders.

#### NOTICE OF INTENT TO AWARD

The Notice of Intent to Award is subject to execution of a written contract and, as a result, the Notice does not constitute the formation of a contract between the Agency and the apparent successful bidder.



Parents, guardians, educators, and anyone responsible for children must rely on drug prevention education to safeguard children and teens from this growing threat.

Speak honestly with your kids pout choices and risky behaviors



Be clear and consistent about family rules, boundaries, and guidelines.



Encourage positive friendships and encourage them to find things that interest them.



Correct wrong beliefs they may have with factual information. Help them learn, don't just lecture.



Stay educated on current drug trends so you can teach your children.



Listen to what they have to say, respect their opinions, and do not be judgmental.



Create a safe space for them to ask questions. Never make them feel wrong for wanting to know more about drugs.



Educate them about online safety and safe and healthy social media use.



While fentanyl is sold by itself, it is very rarely sought out by kids looking to experiment with drugs. Unfortunately, many individuals who aren't trying to use fentanyl end up in contact with it. This is because it is used as an additive to many illicit drugs. There have been traces of fentanyl found in heroin, cocaine, meth, and even marijuana. There are even fentanyl pills that are pressed to look like other legitimate prescription drugs. Adolescents who are experimenting with drugs are becoming more and more at risk.

## How are Kids Getting Fentanyl?

Drug dealers use social media apps for advertising and selling their products. Prospective buyers use the apps and can easily search for drugs using codewords, emojis, hashtags, and other means. Drug traffickers also advertise using posts and stories; as quickly as accounts are shut down, a new one takes its place.

The buyer will direct message or comment on the post using code words or emojis. Conversations will then move to encrypted messaging platforms like Signal, WhatsApp, or Telegram. Once the deal is made, payment is made through Venmo, Paypal, or cryptocurrency. The packages are then shipped via standard post.

This disturbing trend becomes even worse when you realize that the majority of the drug bought this way are usually tainted with fentanyl. Unsuspecting adolescents who think they are experimenting with a non-lethal drug are in grave danger.


